Objective (Description of the service being provided; History of service provision)	<p>With the guidance of the faculty-in-charge (FIC), the students are guided to assess the training and education needs of a specific target group (e.g., pregnant/lactating women, children, adolescents, adults, and elderly, and community health workers) in a low-income community. They are also guided in formulating an instructional design for a nutrition education session. They implement the instructional design to the chosen target group, and document and evaluate the seminar or training session.</p> <p>The FIC partners with the Quezon City Health Department in implementing the course in one of the city's barangays.</p>
