Consultants, resident, and paramedical staff (e.g., physical therapists, occupational therapist, speech and language pathologists, and psychologists) provide consultation and essential rehabilitation services to beneficiaries.</p> <p>Disability First Foundation, Inc. is an accredited CPD (Continuing Professional Development program) provider for PT, OT, Nursing, and Medicine by the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC).</p> <p>Physician for Peace (PFP) Philippines is an affiliate of Physicians for Peace and has become a self-sustaining organization. The field office mobilizes a corps of local medical volunteers year-round to train others and advocates to help amputees walk again, give sight to the nearly blind and heal the emotional and physical scars of burn victims.</p>
